## What Does a Service Coordinator Do?

Instructions: Service coordinators in early intervention are busy, busy. They have many specific duties some of which involve interacting with the child and family directly and others that are directed at and involve the many other players in the Part C system .

On Handout 2, you'll find the definition of "service coordinator services" as given at \$303.34 of the Part C regulations. Parts of that definition are paraphrased below as items #1-14.Work with a partner. Categorize each type of service or duty in the definition of "service coordinator services" as either:

- A | "Family-directed responsibility"—direct assistance to (and interaction with) the child and family
- B | "Behind-the-scene responsibility"—interaction with other Part C agencies and professionals on behalf of the child and family
